

## Introduction

The 2025 General Elections were held almost five (5) years after the last General Elections. The successful implementation of Electronic Tabulating Machines (ETMs) in 2020, alongside several amendments to the Elections Act of 2019, played a significant role in enhancing the organization of this election. Additionally, the continued commitment of our Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, and Poll Clerks, all of whom had received training in the use of ETMs and Electronic Poll Books, proved to be invaluable.

Teams organized themselves with the help of Returning Officer - Daphne Jacobs-Richardson to undertake many hours of training using the Electronic Poll Book and the Electronic Tabulating Machines. The Writ of Elections was announced on January 29, 2025. However, due to time constraints, face to face public education sessions in the electoral districts were not conducted. Instead, the Central Electoral Office leveraged social media and printed media to keep voters informed.

The election process was observed by a team of local observers selected by the Governor's Office and the Anguilla Evangelical Association. Training and logistics for the Anguilla Independent Citizens Observers Team were also coordinated by the Governor's Office. The team leaders were Cannon Reid Simon, Pastor Dwayne Adams, Ivan Francis and Krystie Permuy.

## Office Administration

The Central Electoral Office conducted its operations with the following staff:-

Additionally, Ms Suzette Harrigan of the Department of Public Administration was deployed to the Central Electoral Office during peak demand periods and was of great assistance.

Technical support was provided to the Central Electoral Office by the Department of Information Technology and E-Government Services (DITES), specifically, Mr Clemaurde Gumbs. He was instrumental in updating the Central Electoral Office website with current voters' lists and press releases.



## Continuous Registration Process

Anguilla operates a system of continuous voter registration under the Elections Act, 2019 (as amended). Eligible individuals may register at any time if they meet the following criteria:

- Be **at least 18 years old**
- Be an **Anguillian citizen**
- Meet the **residency requirements** as stipulated in the Anguilla Constitution
  - An Anguillian for at least five years immediately before the last day of the quarter in which the application is made.
  - Alternatively, an Anguillian who has resided in Anguilla for less than five years but at least one year before the application and is either:
    - ❖ The lawful spouse, widow, widower, son, or daughter of a person born in Anguilla.
    - ❖ The lawful spouse of the son or daughter of a person born in Anguilla.

Registration is conducted continuously with voters' lists for each district being posted quarterly. The final registration date prior to the 2025 General Election was January 29, 2025. The following table details voter registration activity from the first quarter of 2024 to the first quarter of 2025 leading up to the elections.

Between January 1, 2024 and December 31, 2024, only two hundred and sixty-three (263) new voters were registered. There was a sharp increase in registrations recorded during the first quarter of 2025; a total of five hundred and sixty-one (561) new voters were registered by the last day of registration before the General Elections.

The Revised Preliminary List also known as the Register of Voters for the 2025 General Elections recorded 12,550 registered voters, reflecting a 5% increase over the 11,951 registered voters in the 2020 General Elections. The continuous voter registration program was further enhanced by the issuance of Voter Registration Cards, which were successfully used in the 2025 General Elections.

## Advance Polls Registration and Voting

A total of 678 applications for advance voting were submitted by the February 10, 2025 deadline. These applications were reviewed and approved in accordance with the criteria outlined in the Elections Act 2019, as amended. It was later observed that the number of applications for advance voting in 2025 was approximately 9% lower than in 2020. In response, the Supervisor of Elections initially attempted to accept late applications. However, it was later determined that this would be contrary to Electoral Act. As a result, the thirty eight (38) late applicants were not permitted to vote. The Supervisor of Elections issued a public apology for the misunderstanding prior to the 2025 General Elections.

The Advance Polls for the 2025 General Elections were held in the cafeteria of the Albena Lake Hodge Comprehensive School - Quarter Campus (Campus Q), providing a centralized location for voters from all districts. Polling stations opened at 9:00 a.m. and closed at 4:00 p.m. Voting was smooth but saw inactivity in the afternoon due to a lower than expected turnout.

## Overview of the 2025 General Elections

### Details of Candidates

Nomination Day was on February 7, 2025. A total of thirty four (34) candidates were duly nominated to contest the 2025 General Elections. This consisted of nineteen (19) candidates contesting across seven (7) districts and fifteen (15) candidates contesting island-wide. Tables 3 and 4 below shows the breakdown of the candidates by districts and party affiliation.

Tables 3 and 4 above show that three (3) major parties were represented – Anguilla Progressive Movement (APM); Anguilla United Front (AUF); and the Anguilla Reliable Team (ART). There were five (5) independent candidates. The APM and AUF had representatives contesting across all seven (7) single member districts; while the ART contested in Road North, Road South, West End and Island-Wide districts respectively. The most contested district was District 1 – Island Harbour, with four candidates including two (2) independents and one (1) candidate each from APM and AUF parties.

The 2025 General Elections were held on February 26, 2025, with voting commencing at 6:00 a.m. across all twenty (20) polling stations. Voter turnout was strong in the morning with heavy participation reported at all locations.

- Total Registered Voters: 12,550
- Total Ballots Cast: 7,529
- Blank Ballots Cast: 8
- Spoiled Ballots: 263
- Voter Turnout: 60% - Overall average across all districts
- Highest Voter Turnout: Sandy Hill - 65.64%
- Lowest Voter Turnout: Island Harbour - 56.54%
- Most Spoiled Ballots: Road South - 59 ballots
- Fewest Spoiled Ballots: Valley North - 17 ballots

The data includes total votes cast per candidate, as well as any recorded over-votes (where a ballot had more selections than allowed) and under-votes (where fewer selections were made than permitted). These results provide insight into voter preferences and the competitive landscape within each district.

At 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, Districts 1 and 4 still had voters in line. In accordance with electoral procedures, these individuals were allowed to cast their ballots. This resulted in a delay of the tabulation process. The Central Electoral Office opted to wait for all twenty Tabulating Machines to arrive at the House of Assembly, before beginning the official count.

Tabulation commenced after all machines were received and continued until after midnight. The proceedings were live streamed with the technical support provided by Mr Vaughn Hazell and the staff of DITES and GAF. The event was also carried live on local media ensuring transparency.

Expert commentary and analysis were presented by Mr Keithstone Greaves of the Department of Information and Broadcasting and Attorney Carlyle Rogers.

## Recommendations

*(3 & 4 are adapted from the 2015 Report, reiterated, and made a part herein)*

1. Revise or delete the constitutional provision on residence as a requirement for voter registration.
2. Delete Section 63 (2) of the Election Act 2019, and replace it with text that makes it possible for voters in the special categories to vote at an Advance Poll on presentation of their Voter's Identification card and their employment identification card. Voters who qualify due to physical incapacity should present a doctor's certificate.
3. Priority should be given to the redrawing of the electoral boundaries which have not been changed since they were first drawn in 1972. Changes in Anguilla's demography (expansion of residential areas and patterns of settlement) have created a situation where there are serious disparities in the distribution of registered voters among the seven electoral districts. This situation is not good for our democracy, and I recommend that a redrawing of the boundaries should be undertaken before the next general election constitutionally due in 2030.
4. The election act should be amended to regulate party campaign finance. Such regulation should include the requirement for public disclosure of contributors to, and recipients of, election campaign expenses in addition to providing other controls and checks.
5. Amend the Elections Act, Section 60, Advance Polls to include:
  - Fire and Rescue Officers
  - Agents
  - Local observers

6. Amend the Elections Act to articulate the role of the Deputy Supervisor of Elections.
7. Amend the Elections Act to exempt voters 70 years and over registering for Advance Polls.
8. Provision be made to allow for toilet and lunch breaks for election officials.
9. Voter education sessions should be conducted in each district periodically especially leading up to a General Election.



## Conclusion

The 2025 General Elections were successfully conducted despite time constraints and procedural challenges. The use of Electronic Tabulating Machines and Electronic Poll Books contributed to a more efficient process, while continuous voter registration ensured broad electoral participation. However, the need for further constitutional and electoral reforms was evident, particularly regarding voter registration requirements and Advance Poll accessibility. The dedication of election officers, technical teams, and supporting institutions played a crucial role in the smooth execution of the elections. Moving forward, implementing the recommended reforms will enhance the electoral system and further strengthen democratic processes in Anguilla.


